





- London and St. Thomas (n=500)
- Chatham-Kent (n=250)
- Huron-Perth (n=250)
- Woodstock (n=250)



Conducted from January 17 to February 12, 2024



Survey conducted by phone and online.



Weighted to match the populations of the region













#### FINAL THOUGHTS

- 1. Residents are generally happy with the quality of life in Western Ontario.
- 2. But housing affordability has become a universal concern and Western Ontario is no exception.
- 3. Issues relating the housing, cost of living, homelessness, healthcare and mental health/drug addiction are present across all regions
- 4. There is a significant gap between expected government action and perceived government action today
